"EPHESIANS: WHO WE ARE AND HOW WE LIVE – <u>IN CHRIST</u>" "A Transforming Prayer" Part Seven: Ephesians 3:14-21 August 2, 2020 Pastor Lloyd Brock Pekin First Nazarene

INTRODUCTION:

This is one of my favorite sections of Ephesians, and I believe there's some things that will incredibly encourage you today because of what the Apostle Paul has to say in this section. First, it's all about how <u>GOD CAN EMPOWER US</u> in a new way in our lives. There are three simple ways to look at how God empowers our prayer life. Some very simple things of what Paul has to say about how he prays and how it worked in his life I want to show you at the very beginning of this that will be helpful and bring a new sense of being empowered.

Secondly, how to develop a <u>CONFIDENT FAITH</u> in your life. How do you develop the kind of faith like Paul or Peter who had this boldness, this confidence, about their faith? We look at that and think, "How could I develop that in my life? How can I have that be a part of my life?" We are going to see how in this prayer that he prayed. He teaches us the three simple things that you and I can do to grow in confidence in our faith every day of our lives.

We have seen 2 prayers in Ephesians:

• Ephesians 1:17-19 is a "prayer for enlightenment"

"I pray that the eyes of your heart may be <u>enlightened</u> so you can see the hope that He's called you to and the riches of His calling," (1:18)

• Ephesians 3:14-21 is a "prayer for enablement or empowerment"

"He may strengthen you with power through His Spirit" (3:16)

Ephesians 3:14-21 (NIV)

¹⁴ For this <u>reason</u> I <u>kneel</u> before <u>the Father</u>, ¹⁵ from whom every family in heaven and on earth derives its name. ¹⁶ I pray that out of His glorious riches He may strengthen you with power through His Spirit in <u>your inner being</u>, ¹⁷ so that Christ may <u>dwell</u> in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being <u>rooted and established in love</u>, ¹⁸ may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, <u>to grasp how wide and long and high and</u> <u>deep is the love of Christ</u>, ¹⁹ and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God. ²⁰ Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work <u>within us</u>, ²¹ to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen.

HOW TO DEVELOP A CONFIDENT FAITH

1. Confidence comes from the

"I pray that out of His glorious riches He may strengthen you with power through His Spirit in **your inner being**" (v. 16)

The "inner being" can see (Psalm 119:18), hear (Matthew 13:9) and taste (Psalm 34:8). The inner being also must be exercised (1 Timothy 4:7-8), kept clean (Psalm 51:7) and fed (Matthew 4:4).

The result: Christ dwelling "in your heart" through faith! That's leads to a confident faith! "So that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith." (v. 17)

2. Confidence comes from grasping

"And I pray that you, being <u>rooted and established in love</u>, ¹⁸ may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love *of Christ*" (vs. 17b-18)

- First: Be rooted and established in love. You must have this so that you can
- Grasp it! How wide, long, high, and deep is the love of Christ! Then you are
- Filled with God. That brings about a confident faith! (v. 19)

 20 Now to Him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to His power that is at work within us, ²¹ to Him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen.
