"THE THREE CHAIRS" Sunday, June 6, 2021 Pastor Lloyd Brock Pekin First Nazarene

INTRODUCTION - THE THREE CHAIRS: Describes spiritual drift or test of passion for God.

This principle is seen best in what happened in the generation that follows Joshua in the Old Testament. Joshua 24:14-15 contains Joshua's farewell message to Israel.

"Now therefore fear the Lord and serve him in sincerity and in faithfulness. Put away the gods that your fathers served beyond the River and in Egypt, and serve the Lord. And if it is evil in your eyes to serve the Lord, choose this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your fathers served in the region beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you dwell. But as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord." (Illustrated by the First Chair)

Joshua 24:31 and Judges 2:7 explain what happened in the next generation. (The Second Chair)

"Israel served the Lord <u>all the days of Joshua</u>, and <u>all the days of the elders</u> who outlived Joshua and **had known all the work that the Lord did for Israel.**"

"And the people served the Lord all the days of Joshua, and all the days of the elders who outlived Joshua, who had seen all the great work that the Lord had done for Israel."

Judges 2:10-12 reveals what happened in the third generation. (Illustrated by the Third Chair)

"And Joshua the son of Nun, the servant of the Lord, died at the age of 110 years. And they buried him within the boundaries of his inheritance in Timnath-heres, in the hill country of Ephraim, north of the mountain of Gaash. And all that generation also were gathered to their fathers. And there arose another generation after them who did not know the Lord or the work that he had done for Israel."

Prayer: Does not believe in or practice prayer, except in dire emergencies.
